# How do I earn points for my House?




**Most points will be earned by demonstrating the 15

Teachers will award points on their phones or keep track in class.






# 15 Champion Essentials

1. Answer respectfully when responding to an adult, such as "yes, ma'am" or "no, thank you". Slang is not an appropriate response.





i. When someone is speaking, acknowledge them by looking in the direction of the speaker. If someone makes a comment, turn and face that person.



3. Say please when asking for something, and say thank you when someone gives us something or does something for you.





4. Follow school and classroom rules, no matter which adult is present (substitute, bus driver, cafeteria worker, etc.), including field trips.






5. Open and hold doors

7. No matter what the circumstances, always be honest. If you have done something wrong, people will respect your honesty.




8. Live by this phrase,

9. Include everyone. We are a family and should treat everyone with respect.






10. If someone bumps into
