




Directions for Selecting Courses in Career Cruising




From the PHS homepage, go to Our Students or go to the guidance tab, and then select **Career Cruising**.




Type in your **login information**. This is your usual PHS computer login, with “PRO-” in front of your user name.




Select, **Choose My Courses**, located on the left side of the page.




For your next year grade level, choose the required courses and electives. You will also need to choose alternate elective courses. You can not submit without the alternate courses listed.




When you select a subject area, a pop-up window appears with your choices. Make sure to check pre-requisites or applications before selecting a course.




Click, **Add Course**, when you have selected the correct course. Add course is located at the bottom of the page.



When selecting an elective, all courses are listed by department.



You may also select **Keyword** and search by the course name.



Courses requiring an application or tryout cannot be submitted. Students should choose a course that they would take if the application is not approved or the tryout was unsuccessful. Applications can be found on the PHS website Course Selection page under Guidance, and/or a link will be available in Career Cruising.

Level 3 The AP US History course provides students with the analytic skills and factual knowledge necessary to deal critically with the problems and materials in US history. Students will learn to assess historical materials—their relevance to a given interpretive problem, reliability, and importance—and to weigh the evidence and interpretations presented in historical scholarship. AP US History develops the skills necessary to arrive at conclusions on the basis of an informed judgment and to present reasons and evidence clearly and persuasively in essay format.
